# 2ND SUNDAY OF ADVENT - NEED FOR REPENTANCE

Homecoming is the central theme of the Scripture readings for the Second Sunday of Advent. All three readings focus on the absolute necessity of our getting ready for Christ's "Homecoming" into our hearts and lives by true repentance, reparation, prayer and the renewal of our lives. They also remind us that the past coming of Jesus, some 2000 years ago, the present daily coming of Jesus into our lives through the Eucharistic celebration, through the Scriptures and through the praying community, and his future coming (the Second Coming) are actually the fulfillment of God's saving plan for us all, from all eternity

**WE NEED TO PREPARE FOR THE REBIRTH OF JESUS:** We are invited by the Church to prepare for Christmas by repenting of our sins and renewing our lives so that Jesus may be reborn in us. Let us remember with the German mystic Angelus Silesius "Christ could be born a thousand times in Bethlehem – but all in vain until He is born in me."

**WE NEED TO ALLOW JESUS TO BE REBORN IN OUR LIVES.** People around us should recognize Jesus' rebirth in our lives by our sharing love, unconditional forgiveness, compassionate and merciful heart, and spirit of humble and committed service.

**LET US ACCEPT THE CHALLENGE** of John the Baptist to turn this Advent season into a real spiritual "homecoming" by making the necessary preparations for the fresh arrival of our Lord and Savior Jesus into our hearts.



# Know Our Faith ADVENT TRADITIONS AND SYMBOLS

- Purple is the color of Advent; It represents preparation, repentance, and royalty as we hopefully await the coming of the true King, Jesus.
- The 3rd Sunday of Advent's color is rose (pink), which represents joy.
- + The Advent wreath has origins in Germany; "historians have suggested that pre-Christian Germanic peoples would light candles around wreaths in the dark winter months in anticipation of the warmer, lighter months in springtime. This tradition likely evolved into the 'Advent Wreath' at some point during the Middle Ages..."
- "The circular shape of the Advent wreath symbolizes God's infinite love for us - it is never-ending."
- → The evergreen leaves of the wreath remind us to reflect on the "everlasting nature of God."
- The traditional meaning of the Advent wreath is to help us prepare the way for the "Light of the World, Jesus."
- + During Advent, the decorations in the Church are more simple, as is the music. We also do not sing the Gloria during Advent.
- ★ Advent calendars "can help you fully enter into the season with daily activity and prayer suggestions" to prepare us to celebrate the birth of Jesus.
