# DECEMBER 03, 2023 ~ YEAR B 1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT REFLECTION: "What I Say to You I Say to All: Keep Awake."

#### 1ST SUNDAY OF ADVENT - KEEP AWAKE!

The central theme of today's readings is Jesus' warning to us to be alert, watchful and prepared because Christ's Second Coming, coinciding with the end of the world, can occur at any time.

People, in general, have a paranoid fear about the end of the world. But Jesus, in today's Gospel, gives us the assurance that we need not be afraid of the end of the world, Christ's Second Coming, and the Last Judgment, if we remain alert and prepared. The Church invites us on this first Sunday of Advent to prepare for Christ's Second Coming, 1) by properly celebrating during this Christmas season the fond memory of Christ's first coming 2000 years ago, 2) by experiencing Christ's daily advent or coming in every Eucharistic celebration, in the Holy Bible, and in the worshipping community, and 3) by preparing daily for Jesus' Second Coming which, for us, will happen at the unknown moment of our death or the equally unknown moment when the World will end.

Life messages: Live in the living presence of Jesus every day. The message of today's Scripture is that we should live in the living presence of Jesus every day waiting for his Second Coming. We can experience Christ's living presence in the Holy Eucharist, in the Holy Bible, in the worshiping community of our parish, in our family, in our own souls, and in everyone around us. The early Christians experienced the living presence and coming of Jesus with absolute certainty. So their mutual greeting was not "Hi!" or "Good Morning!" but the Aramaic, "Maran Atha" which means "Come, Lord Jesus." May God bless you, and keep you ever prepared for Christ's second coming.

# Know Our Faith What is Advent

Advent is the **beginning** of the Church's liturgical year and is a season of preparation.

+ The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word "adventus" which means "a coming, approach, arrival."

- During Advent we prepare to celebrate again the birth of Jesus at Christmas. We also prepare our hearts and minds for the second coming of Christ, even though we don't know when he will come.
- Like Lent, Advent is also a season of waiting, preparation, and penance, but Advent is a "uniquely joyous and hopeful season in the Church." (hallow.com)
- + The main theme of the 1st Sunday of Advent is **Hope.**
- \* "The vision of life that Advent gives us is two-fold; it looks back to the first coming of Christ at Bethlehem, and it looks to the future when Christ will come again. In the interval between these two events we find meaning for our life as Christians."
- \* "We are all searching for something in life. Most of us want to be happy, but for sure no other time of year reveals the fact that we all want something. The question, of course, is what do you want? More importantly, what are you searching for? We often search in the externals of life, hoping that in the 'things' of this world we will find what we are searching for. But wisdom tells us that it is in the quiet that we discover the more profound things of life." ~ Rejoice: Finding Your Place in the Advent Story by Fr. Mark Toups

#### IMMACULATE CONCEPTION OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Solemnity - December 08, 2023

The dogma of the Immaculate Conception was declared by Pope Pius IX in 1854. He declared that the Blessed Virgin Mary "in the first instance of her conception, by a singular privilege and grace, granted by God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Saviour of the human race, was preserved exempt from all stain of original sin." In other words, Mary was redeemed by Jesus's sacrifice on the cross, the same way we are. However, since God is outside of time, he gave her that grace in advance so that she could be a pure vessel to bear God in her body. Many early Church Fathers



and saints wrote about Mary's sinlessness. "The 'splendor of an entirely unique holiness' by which Mary is 'enriched from the first instant of her conception' comes wholly from Christ; she is 'redeemed. in a more exalted fashion. reason of the merits of her Son.' The Father blessed Mary

more than any other created person 'in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places' and chose her 'in Christ before the foundation of the world, to be holy and blameless before him in love."




