DECEMBER 17, 2023 ~ YEAR B 3rd SUNDAY OF ADVENT REFLECTION: "I Baptize with Water. Among You Stands ... the One Who is Coming After Me."

3rd SUNDAY OF ADVENT - My Spirit Finds Joy in God My Saviour.

The third Sunday of Advent is called "Gaudete Sunday" because the Mass for today (in its original Latin text), begins with the opening antiphon: "Gaudete in Domino semper" – "Rejoice in the Lord always." To remind ourselves that we are preparing for the very joyful occasion of the birth of Jesus, we light the rose candle in the Advent wreath, and the priest may wear rose vestments.

The common theme of the day's Scripture readings is one of joy and encouragement. The readings urge us to make the preparations required of us as we await the rebirth of Jesus in our hearts and lives. Holy Scripture reminds us that the coming of Jesus, past, present, and future, is the reason for our rejoicing. The Prophet Isaiah, in the **first reading**, encourages the Jewish exiles returning from Babylon to rejoice because their God, Yahweh, is their strong Guide, Provider and Protector.

In today's **Responsorial Psalm** (Luke 1:46 ff.) Mary rejoices in the great blessing given to her, exclaiming: "*My soul glorifies the Lord; my spirit finds joy in God my Savior.*"

St. Paul, in the **second reading**, advises the Thessalonian Christians to "rejoice always" by leading blameless, holy and thankful lives guided by the Holy Spirit, because Christ's second coming is near, and he is faithful in his promise to reward them.

Today's **Gospel** tells us that John the Baptist came to bear witness to Jesus as the Light of the world. The Baptizer wants all the Jews to rejoice because the long-expected Messiah, as the light of the world, will remove the darkness of sin from the world. We rejoice at the humility of John the Baptist, who tells the Sanhedrin members challenging him that he is unworthy even to become the slave of Jesus the Messiah. We also rejoice in the sincerity and commitment of John who spent himself completely in preparing people for the longawaited Messiah. We have an additional reason to rejoice because, like John the Baptist, we, too, are chosen to bear witness to Christ Jesus, the Light of the world.

We extend our heartfelt sympathy and prayers to the Nordick family on the passing of Allen and Maybelle. Please keep Allen and Maybelle in your prayers, and may God's comfort and peace be with the family in their time of grief.



Prayers will be held on Sunday, December 17 at 7:00 pm and the Funeral Mass celebrated on Monday, December 18 at 2:00 pm. May their souls and the souls of all the faithful departed rest in peace.

- OR Mass on Sunday, Dec. 24, before 4 pm

Dec 25 - The Nativity of Our Lord

- Anticipatory Mass on Sunday, Dec. 24, after 4 pm
- OR Mass on Monday, Dec. 25

Dec 31 - The Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph

- Anticipatory Mass on Saturday, Dec. 30, after 4 pm
- OR Mass on Sunday, Dec. 31, before 4 pm

Jan 1 - Solemnity of Mary, The Holy Mother of God

- Anticipatory Mass on Sunday, Dec. 31, after 4 pm
- OR Mass on Monday, Jan. 1

E-transfer donations. Donations may be mailed to the parish or the Chancery office post marked no later than December 29 to be eligible for a 2023 tax receipt. All donations received after 12 noon on Friday, December 29, or are post marked later than December 29, will go towards the 2024 Tax Receipt.

Likewise, if you plan to attend another parish between now and the end of the year, or at Christmas, please bring your offering envelope directly to the parish office if you require your donation to be on your 2023 tax receipt. If it is not in the parish office or postmarked on December 29th it will not be included in the 2023 tax receipt year as per CRA directives. Please keep this information in mind.




