In his Message for Lent this year, Pope Francis invites us into the desert. He wrote: "Let us welcome Lent as the great season in which he reminds us: 'I am the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery' (Ex 20:2). Lent is a season of conversion, a time of freedom. Jesus himself, as we recall each year on the first Sunday of Lent, was driven into the desert by the Spirit in order to be tempted in freedom. For forty days, he will stand before us and with us: the incarnate Son. Unlike Pharaoh, God does not want subjects, but sons and daughters. The desert is the place where our freedom can mature in a personal decision not to fall back into slavery".

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent. May it be a time of rediscovering our freedom from sin and death in Jesus. www.stbensnd.org)

Remembering Vocations in your Lenten Devotions

Meditation in the words of His Holiness, Pope Francis:

friends, Lent is the favorable season for renewing our encounter with Christ, living in his word, in the sacraments and in our neighbor. The Lord, who overcame the deceptions of the Tempter during the forty days in the desert, shows us the path we must take." "Let us pray for one another so that, by sharing in the victory of Christ, we may open our doors to the weak and poor. Then we will be able to experience and share in full the joy of Easter."

Catholic Faith PRAYER, FASTING, AND ALMSGIVING Know Your

- + Prayer, fasting, and almsgiving are three forms of penance that help us to transform ourselves, strengthen our relationship with God, and serve others. (See CCC 1434)
- God is always seeking us and desires us to encounter Him. Prayer is the way in which we respond to God's gifts to us and develop a relationship with Him. (See CCC 2591)
- Observing the days of *fasting* and abstinence during the Church year is one of the precepts of the Church. Fasting helps us practice self-discipline and learn to control our instincts. It also helps to prepare us for the celebration of Easter. (see CCC 2043)
- **Almsgiving** is giving of our resources to the poor. We serve others both physically and spiritually. Giving alms is one of the most important ways to practice charity to others. (See CCC 2447)

Forever Ambassadors of Christ Reflection for Ash Wednesday

Has anyone ever asked you, "What is that on your forehead?" Each year on Ash Wednesday, we Catholics display a sign telling the world that we are followers of Christ, that we are sinful but hopeful in our redemption through the paschal mystery. The ashes remind us that we are in relationship with God, who sent his only Son to redeem humanity through the sacrifice on the cross. Throughout the Lenten season, as a community, we ask God for his guidance and mercy as we journey together to repentance and prepare to renew our faith at Easter. The season invites us to return to God with our whole hearts so that we may be not only one with him but also ambassadors for Christ in the world. The Lenten ethos is one of sacrifice, primarily God's sacrifice of Jesus for the salvation of humankind. Through our meager Lenten practices, we join in the sacrifice of Christ in the hope of sharing also in his resurrection. Jesus goes into the desert before he begins his public ministry to be alone with God as he readies himself for what is to come. Jesus put his complete trust in God. This season calls for a pause in our lives through prayer, fasting, and almsgiving so that we too may grow closer to God.

Saint Mark's Gospel reveals the unthinkable. Jesus reaches out and touches a leper. He risks catching the contagious disease and heals the man. As the Gospel story teaches, no one is abandoned by Christ. Are there those in our society or in our personal lives for whom we ascribe no hope, who we have abandoned, treated like lepers? Or, as Christ's stewards of our sisters and brothers, do we risk reaching out and touching those who may seem to us to be "unclean" or not worthy of our time or attention?
