### FEBRUARY 18, 2024 ~ YEAR B Ist SUNDAY OF LENT REFLECTION: "Jesus Was Tempted By Satan."



#### **1ST SUNDAY OF LENT - OVERCOMING THE POWERS OF EVIL**

At the beginning of Lent, God once again leads us into the desert and invites us to listen to His word. Why? Because the path of a disciple of Christ leads to encountering the Word of God: reading it, studying it, reflecting on it, contemplating the divine works revealed within it, and daily trusting in the wisdom it contains. In the Word of God, Christians seek the grace to journey through the desert of temporality, toward the realm of eternal life.

Before Jesus begins His public ministry, following His baptism by John, the Holy Spirit leads Him into the wilderness for a period of forty days. There, in silence and prayer, He prepares Himself for His mission.

The temptation of the Son of God in the wilderness is an important lesson for us. Firstly, it shows that spiritual warfare takes place in our lives every day and that no one is immune to it. In fact, the closer we are to God, the more Satan tries to distance us from Him. Secondly, mere knowledge of the Word is not enough. Understanding, experiencing God, and trusting in His promises is crucial. Satan's actions may even involve using Scripture to raise doubts about God's promises and intentions. Jesus' behavior reminds us that He relied on the Word and walked in God's path.

Today's passage from the Gospel according to Mark, in its simplicity, renders Jesus as the promised and awaited Messiah, the Christ, and the Son of God. He came to earth to overthrow Satan's dominion over the world. He dismantles the kingdom of lies, evil, and pride, proclaiming the Kingdom of God. During the temptation, Jesus' weapon was the Word of God. After all, God's will is embedded in His Word. Today, Jesus reminds us that faith is essential for the development of God's Kingdom within us and around us – faith that turns away from evil, breaks free from sin, and fully trusts in turning toward God.


#### **CATECHESIS AT HOLY FAMILY PARISH**

# Catholic Faith PRAYER, FASTING, AND ALMSGIVING

- Know Your + **PRAYER**: Mark your calendar in order to plan on attending one or more Lenten services over the next six weeks, such as Stations of the Cross, the Parish Mission, a Bible study, or the Penance Service.
  - **FASTING:** Consider the ways food is wasted or consumed carelessly. This week, make an effort to eat only until you feel satisfied rather than full.
  - + **ALMSGIVING:** Give up something you usually buy for yourself, such as a cup of coffee or a song downloaded from the Internet. Double the amount you would have spent and place it in the collection basket at church or purchase gift cards to hand out to the homeless.

#### FOR DEEPER CONTEMPLATION **ABUNDANT MERCY**

"See, I am now establishing my covenant with you" and your descendants after you and with every little creature." With these words, God shows his love as he promises anew to be in relationship with creation. In the reading from the First Letter of Peter, we hear that God saved the eight who were aboard the ark through the waters of the flood and now saves us through the waters of baptism. God, whose love brought us into being, seeks relationship and communion with us. To reconcile us with him, he sent his Son, who prepared for his mission by fasting for forty days in the desert. During the forty days of Lent, many of us give in to temptation and find ourselves repenting time and again. Knowing that God is merciful and understands our shortcomings, we can always resolve to begin anew. God yearns for relationship with us and does not give up on us. As one of your Lenten practices, you may have chosen to read the day's Scriptures attentively. Try to approach the readings with fresh eyes willing to allow the text to relate to your life today. Familiar texts can speak to us in the new circumstances, challenges, joys, and sorrows of our lives. All we need is an openness to the Word. God's Word is always relevant.




